President's Tour: May 19th by Chuck McVey

The morning of May 19th we met in Idaho at the gas station on 15th Street. Everyone was on time and we got out of there about ten minutes late. I forgot to take pictures of the cars and people wondering around chatting with everybody. We need to thank the club president for the cookies she made. If I'm right, she was up late baking.

Upon arriving at the Mission, I was looking for a place to park the cars. Not much parking for a lot of cars arriving all at once. From the pictures, we did manage to park on the road that leads up to the Mission and Parish House. No parking on the grass.

The Mission, or the Sacred Heart Mission as it was once called, has a great story behind it. It was my first time visiting there. I did do some reading of the Parish House and Mission.

The first Mission was along the St Joe River in 1842. The Mission flooded a number of times. In 1846 it was moved to the current location.

The Mission is around 90 feet high and 40 feet wide. The six square upright timbers in front are 28 inches square and the two by the alter are three feet by three feet. All are more than 25 feet long, and were hewn and planed with a broad axe. Wooden pegs were used throughout the building to secure all structural members together.

In 1850, the church was taken over by Jesuit Missionary Antonio Rovalli, who began designing the new Mission. He made sure that the building was built by the Indians themselves. It was built using the Wattle & Daub method (an interweaving of rocks and twigs overlaid with clay that is used in building construction) and was finished three years later.

In 1961, the Mission was designated a National Historic Landmark and in 1966 it was put on the National Register of historic Places.

STATE PARK

The Property has two cemeteries, a nature trail and a visitor's center.

The sight became OLD MISSION STATE PARK in 1975 through a long lease with the Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise.

PARISH HOUSE

The parish house was built around the same time the Mission was built in 1850's. The upstairs was used as sleeping quarters, down stairs was used as a kitchen,

office and chapel. The chapel was use mostly for daily Mass. Fires destroyed two early parish houses. In 1880, miners, farmers and military personal came to North Idaho.

NEW PARISH HOUSE

In 1887, carpenters set frame work for building the new Parish House. Wood came from Spokane. The hardware was purchased locally. The builder (Brother Achilles Car Parqno) and two craftsmen completed the house exterior by October of that year. Hardwood floors, chimney and other finishing touches had to wait until spring of 1888. The final coat of lath and plaster was applied in September.

In 1909, limited financial resources forced the Jesuits to all but abandon the parish House. In 1924 the Society of Jesus deeded the Parish House and other mission property to the Catholic Diocese of Boise Idaho. The Parish House was moved 50 feet further east to protect the church from fire. In 1973 to 1976 the State of Idaho undertook the complete restoration of the Mission as a National Bicentennial project spending \$310.000. The Mission was painted the original color of pale yellow. In 1986, restoration of the Parish House was started and was opened to the public for viewing in 1987.

If a person walks the trail around the grounds he/she can see the old river channel where the steam boats docked. At the Visitor Center a person will find lots of history; The Grist Mill turned by horse's, the south and west cemeteries, etc. The Center has a short video for viewing, as well as exhibits of the Coeur d' Alene Indians and the Jesuit Missionaries.

JIM AND CAROL LANGSTAFF

We left the Old Mission for the Langstaff's for lunch. Jim and Carol are great hosts. I know everyone was glad to see them. Thanks to Pat Shea, he did a wonderful job on the BBQ.

Ed Rutledge drove himself over to Jim and Carols. He drove his new Ford. We had eight old cars, Bob Long won the drawing, but turned it down. We had someone pull a new number and Mack Cain won.

A nice day, good friends, and good food. The V-8 club thanks our president for a wonderful tour.






