Next meeting at the river August 6th, for more info contact BJ Glander

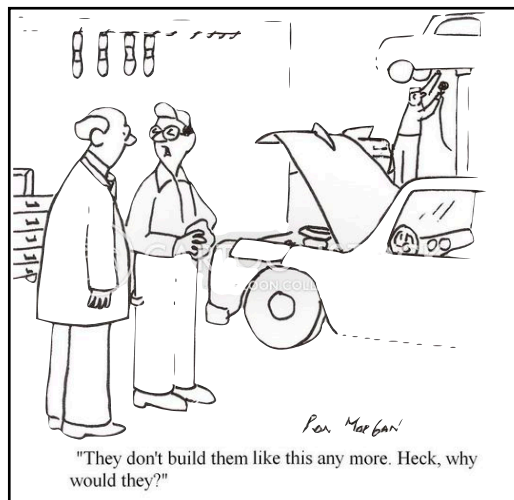
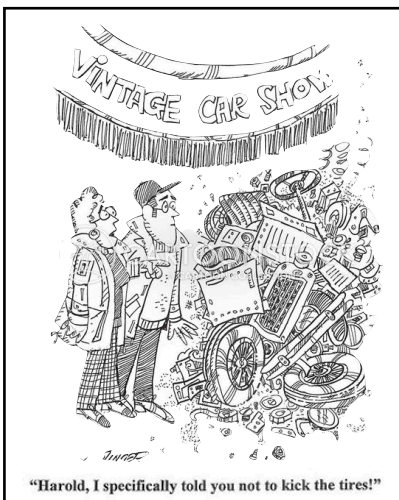
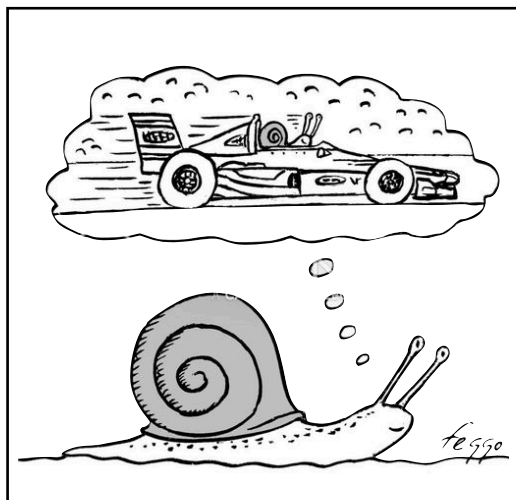

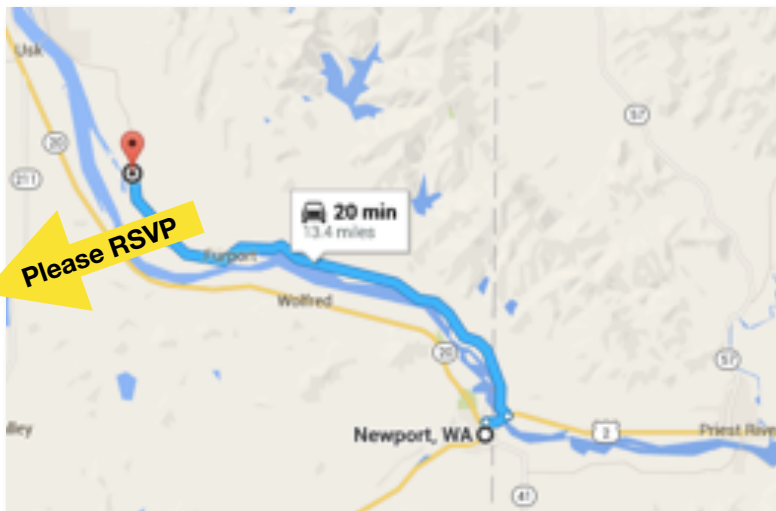


ANNUAL CAMPOUT, PICNIC & MEETING: August 4-6

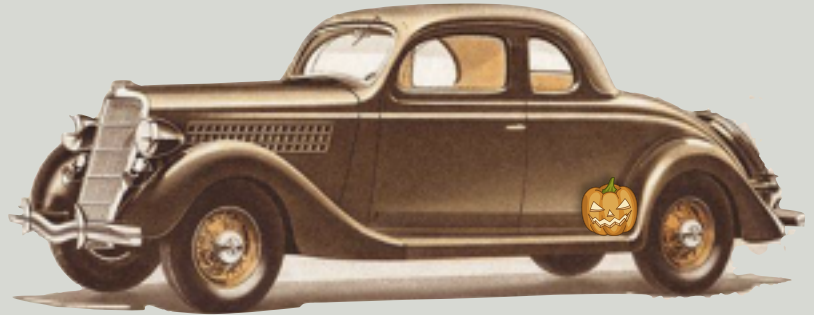

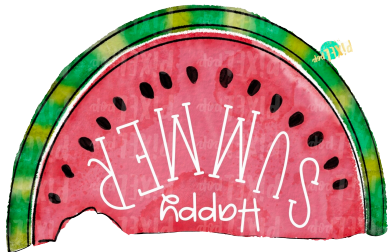
